




**MASK/COSTUME GUIDE FOR THE VIRTUE OF INDUSTRY, WHOSE EMBLEM IS A GOLDEN BALL, ON WHICH STANDS A CUPID (INTIMATING THAT INDUSTRY BRINGS BOTH WEALTH AND LOVE)...**





# INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING YOUR COSTUME:

- 1) Print out this pdf (landscape) on a standard piece of A4 paper and cut out the mask, cupid and all the shapes – the shield, the large circle, the three small circles, the two small hexagons and the upward curved shape.
- 2) Use the mask and shield as templates to trace and cut out both shapes on different coloured card (your choice of colours!)
- 3) Glue the card shield on to the centre of the card mask, so the angled point sits downwards, centrally, just between the mask eyeholes.
- 4) Use the large circle as a template to cut out the same shape from a piece of gold card, or paper – or use the existing paper cut-out, and colour it in gold.
- 5) Use the upward curved shape as a template to cut out the same shape from a piece of either silver or bronze card, or paper – or use the existing paper cut-out, and colour it in either silver or bronze (your choice!).
- 6) Stick the silver or bronze curved shape across the middle of the gold circle (see fig. 1, below)
- 7) Colour in the three small circles and two small hexagons in jewel colours, then stick them in a row across the middle of the upward curved shape (see fig. 2, below)

8) Stick the gold circle the the bottom of the shield that you've already stuck to the mask (see fig. 3, below).

9) Stick the paper cupid on to the shield, so that his feet are resting on the ball (see fig. 4, below).

10) Use a hole-punch to make holes on either side of the mask and then thread a piece of elastic through them and knot at both sides, so you can wear the mask comfortably on your head.

11) You can make your Virtue even more theatrical by sticking/stapling coloured ribbons to the back of your mask, to create 'hair' for yourself. Or add feathers, tinsel... whatever you want to customise your Virtue!

12) Finish off your costume by wrapping up warm in comfy, waterproof clothes, then tying a white bedsheets over one shoulder – for that classical toga look!




